How long have you worked in law enforcement?

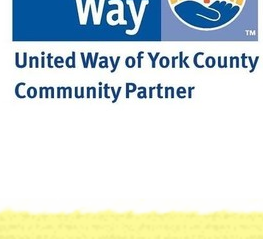
Pitts: I've worked in law enforcement for 12 ½ years.
