## BACK to SCHOOL

This past school year was full of challenges like our community has never seen before. Distance learning, hybrid schedules and unexpected shut-downs had huge impacts on children and their families. Another unexpected impact was decreased exposure to mandated reporters, which resulted in a decline in child abuse reports <u>(click here for more information)</u>.

As we approach the return to school for the 2021/2022 school year, the people tasked with protecting children are preparing for an increase in child abuse reports. We should expect teachers will be hearing about abuse that occurred and having to make more reports. We should expect child protective services workers will be getting an increase in cases to respond to and ensure safety.
